


Your Neighborhood News | Fall 2024


Bagged and canned material will be picked up on regular yard waste days (Wednesdays) over the next few weeks.

- Vote By Mail Ballots may be dropped off in the Secure Ballot Intake Station at any early voting location (but not on Election Day)
